- Communicating with others respectfully and safely
- Understanding ownership of online content and copyright
- Awareness of the power of 'likes' and online reviews
- Awareness of the over-use of technology
- Introduction to appropriate and inappropriate use of AI
- Telling a trusted adult if anything online worries or upsets them

Microsoft Family Safety: Here you can manage the content that your child can access on their device.
